### A Team Spirit IS NEEDED

For Spiritual Revival and Reformation and Mission Accomplishment

The pen of inspiration asserts, "The work of God in this earth can never be finished until men and women comprising our church membership rally to the work and unite their efforts with those of ministers and church officers." (GW, 352)

Here, the prophetess of God clearly explained how we can finish the gospel work. She does not say that either the gospel work will be finished only by lay people without ministers and church administrators or the gospel work will be finished only by pastors and church leaders excluding church members. Instead, she strongly emphasized that the gospel work will be completed when men and women comprising of both laity, clergy and church leaders, unite in Christ to accomplish the sacred task before them!

It is wonderful, isn't it? In order to complete the gospel commission; the church administrators, church pastors and lay members will work together as a team. A team spirit through the power of the Holy Spirit among God's people is crucial to accomplish the gospel work! Then, how can we work together as a team?

How can we work together as a team?

One of the great concerns that Jesus had was the disunity displayed by his disciples. They were precious disciples to Christ, but they were not united among themselves. Quite often they quarreled among themselves for the highest position within their circle. "They came to Capernaum. When he was in the house, he asked them, "What were you arguing about on the road?" But they kept quiet because on the way they had argued about who was the greatest. Sitting down, Jesus called the twelve and said, "If anyone wants to be first, he must be the very last, and the

servant of all." (Mark 9: 33-35)

Jesus overheard their contentious arguments on the way to Capernaum: "Who is the greatest among us?" "I am better than all others, and therefore I must have an important position in the kingdom that will be established by Jesus!" They could not be united. They could not work as a team. And it was a serious problem, and Jesus was greatly concerned about it. Jesus knew that they would never be able to accomplish the mission as long as they were not united. So He called his disciples and said to them that if anyone would like to become the master, he should become the servant of all. And he honestly prayed to the Father for the unity among His disciples, "so that they may be one as we are one." (John 17:11) They needed a team spirit. They needed to understand and respect each other. They needed to work as a team to accomplish the gospel mission.

"It should be understood that perfect unity among the laborers is necessary to the successful accomplishment of the work of God.... We are to demonstrate to the world that men of every nationality are one in Christ Jesus. Then let us remove every barrier and come into unity in the service of the Master." (9T, 196)

The disciples of Jesus were spiritually revived in the upper room. And when they were fully united in team spirit, on the day of Pentecost, the power of the Holy Spirit was poured upon them to empower them to spread the gospel message in "Jerusalem and Judea and Samaria and even to the end of the earth." Likewise, in our days, a team spirit is needed among God's people for Spiritual revival and reformation and mission accomplishment.



The NSD Adventist-laymen's Services and Industries (ASI) held a convention and a general meeting with the theme "Forget not all His benefits" at Phoenix Island Resort, Jeju, Korea from September 1 to 4, 2011. About 350 lay people from Korea, Japan, Mongolia, Hong Kong, Taiwan, USA, Bangladesh, and the Philippines gathered together for spiritual growth and to strengthen the ASI ministries. The ASI convention takes place every three years in order to promote fellowship among Adventist laymen and to share information about each field. This convention was especially meaningful, because it was the NSD's first ASI convention, held separate from the Bi-Division convention with the Southern Asia-Pacific Division. At the meeting, Elder Jong Hyun Song was reappointed to serve as President of the NSD ASI for the next three years. At his acceptance speech, Mr. Song said "although I am weak, I will try to do my best like Simon who helped carry Jesus' Cross."

Adventist-laymen's Service & Industries (ASI) is a membership-based organization of Seventh-day Adventist laypeople who are enthusiastic about participating in the church mission.



# EWS FOCUS NSD W/SS/ON in Jej in Jeju Island

The NSD workers and their families visited Seogwipo Church which is located in Jeju Island, the southernmost island of Korea for the 8th NSD Mission Day on September 20, 2011. Jeju is one of the most attractive places where about 7 million tourists visited the past year. It is more than ten times the population of Jeju, which has 550 thousand people. In Jeju Island, we have ten small churches and 400 church members.

Since 2010 the NSD Mission Day has been held in a local church in order to activate evangelistic work in local churches and to strengthen a mission spirit in the NSD workers. Church members from Seogwipo Church and New Seogwipo Church also participated in the event.

The NSD President's speech that reminded the people of the importance of the Mission Day was

followed by a reading of the NSD Mission Statement. Pastor Kwon ManBok, as a guest speaker, shared his experience and emphasized the importance of house-to-house visitation. Pastor Song EulSub who nurtured a church in Japan for six years as a PMM missionary also talked about the motivation for mission.

#### WHAT IS MISSION DAY?

Mission Day is a day set by denominational organizations to emphasize mission and evangelism among the faculties and staff members and help all the workers to renew their mission/evangelism spirit and provide them opportunities to participate in mission/evangelism activities. Mission Day was first started in 2004 by the Northern Asia-Pacific Division.

#### WHY MISSION DAY?

There are 177 large and small organizations and institutions in the Northern Asia-Pacific Division including the division itself with more than 12,600 employees.

According to the mission statement of all different levels of organizations and institutions it is to proclaim the everlasting gospel which is in Revelation 14:6-13 to those who live on earth-

to every nation, tribe, language, and people. Paul exhorted Timothy to preach the word, to be prepared in season and out of season (2 Timothy 4:2). All the denominational employees should not only participate in evangelism by themselves but should also set good examples for their church members.

If all the institutions set a day as a Mission Day in a year, if every active employee passes out at least 200 tracts, more than two and half million individuals in our division territories will be reached with the Three Angels' Messages.

Therefore, the Northern Asia-Pacific Division started a Mission Day program in 2004 as an experiment to know if it may work before recommending it to subordinate organizations. And as a result of it, the NSD and its staffs found that it was beneficial to them, since the Adventist Church was better introduced to neighbors and business associates. Staffs restored the sense of personal witnessing, strengthened partnership with their colleagues as they visited neighbors and handed out tracts together, and regained confidence in evangelism/mission.

#### 2011 JUC Youth Conference





He asked participants to care for prisoners' families with the loving spirit of Jesus Christ. Hence, the KUC Women's Ministries Department and the Korean Adventist Women's Association will develop a project to care for the families of prisoners in cooperation with Onesimus Mission in the future.

Topics included: Step on the way to salvation, Ways to ensure peace, Facing retribution and judgment, as well as, The preparation to move in to our new home.

### 15th Anniversary of Community Service at Junghwadong Church of East Central Korean Conference

Korea

The Junghwadong Church celebrated the 15th anniversary of its senior education program and free lunch service. The church has been providing this service to the elderly in the community five days a week for the last fifteen years. About 80 elderly people attend the program every day. Senior education programs include health lectures, recreation, singing classes, and laughter therapy. The church also tries to extend its service by providing medical service, beauty treatment, and bath service twice a week.

It was 1996 when the church began this program following the suggestion of Dr. YoungSook Kim, professor of Social Welfare at Sahmyook University. At first, it was a huge burden, because it required steady devotion of volunteer workers as well as financial support. But the church had resolved that this must be done by it. After 3 years of running a senior education program and free lunch service, the head of the borough, - upon hearing of the program - promised regular subsidy so that fine quality food could be provided for the people.

Some people drew unwelcome attention, due to misunderstanding the church's motives. However the church just served the community without any expectation on the part of the participants to attend the regular church services. As a result, people in the community have a good impression of the church and its work.

Sixteen volunteer members work in shifts to treat the elderly to a lunch every day, even on a sweltering or a biting cold day. The lunch is always prepared using the best ingredients. It is not merely a meal served to fill their stomachs, but it's prepared with devotion and love to fill their hearts and souls. Mrs. SookJae Shin, a church deaconess, said "we ought to do this work even as Jesus cared for the suffering, poor, and hungry. I really thank God who has guided this work and the church members who dedicated themselves through service and prayer." A participant in her 70s said "it is a joy in life to meet people, talk with them, and together have a good time."

This education program is a great help to improve the quality of life of the elderly and the lunch service provides a healthy life. The church is still trying to share joy, happiness, and the message of Salvation with senior citizens today. This is a true picture of the remnant church in these last days when Christ's coming is drawing near.







# Former Communist and Atheist Young Man Becomes a Pastor in the Adventist Church through 'Voice of Prophecy' program of AWR

am JeongSu Lee, currently serving the Yanji Gongxin Church in China. In 1988, I met God for the first time in my life through the 'Voice of Prophecy' program. At that time, I attended the Wuhan College which is located at the center of a big city with a population of over 7 million. There were just dozens of Korean-speaking people, but I could not use Korean language. I heard of 'Voice of Prophecy' by chance, as I was turning my radio to look for a Korean program. Though raised and educated in Atheism and Communism I found the message really interesting. I had never seen a church or Bible and I just recognized Christianity as a kind of superstition.

Until then, it was very hard to see a church in China and to have faith in Christianity was unthinkable. People looked on believers with a jaundiced eye. However, the 'Voice of Prophecy' program on AWR was good news to me. So, I recorded the programs and listened to them over and over again. The thing that touched my heart the most was a prayer announcers recited. The hymn sung on the radio also gave me heavenly impression. I met a whole new world I had never known before.

I wrote a letter to the KUC requesting for a copy of the Bible. Then, the then KUC AWR Director sent me a Bible, a church Hymnal, and booklets like 'Faith for Today', 'Daniel' and 'Revelation'. As I listened to the program and studied the Bible, my friends got interested in it, so I listened to the program with 3 to 4 friends. One of them is Pastor YoungWoong Kim, serving at Qingdao Church in China. He went to Korea to study Theology and become a pastor later. I really appreciate those who are related to the 'Voice of Hope' program Korea which kindly led me to this faith. I accepted the gospel through the AWR and got baptized. In 1994, I went to Japan to studied



Theology. After graduation, I worked for a Japanese church for 5 years and was later ordained. Then, I received a call to go to a church in China, where I am serving the Yanji Gongxin Church which has about 300 members now.

God led my life to this faith and dramatically changed my life through the 'Voice of Prophecy' program, so that I could live a new life as a pastor which I could never even dream of. I thank His grace, thinking of how miserable my life would be, if I had not met God through the program. Even now, the gospel is spreading to numerous people in China through the radio. There are still many people who cannot access the internet, while a shortwave radio is portable. It is playing an important role as a gospel spreader. Since no one can interrupt radio waves, it is the best way to convey gospel messages.



# SPECIAL TRAINING FOR ADMINISTRATORS IN ADVENTIST TRAINING CENTER



The KUC Adventist Training Center (ATC) organized a special training program for pastors and held the first session from August 21 to 31, 2011. About 30 pastors including officers and directors from the Korean Union Conference, five Korean local conferences and other pastors participated in this session. These were reminded about the solemn mission






given to ministers. Participants started each day with prayer at 5:30 am and all through the day their souls were immersed in God's word and ceaseless prayer. The training included mission and leadership training as well as spirituality.

Five speakers gave various lectures focusing on different topics and six lay people shared powerful testimonies with participants.





Pastor Jin Young Kim, ATC Director, said "Ministers must practice holiness in their daily lives and humble themselves by communion with God through prayer. The life of a minister should be an example to his sheep and give glory to God."

Pastor SungHa Park, ATC Associate Director, gave lectures on spirituality with topics including 'crisis of

spirituality, 'creation and spirituality,' and 'pastoral leadership'.

Pastor MinHo Joo, ATC Secretary, shed light on Jesus Christ who is the example of prayer through lectures on 'individual prayer,' 'how to pray,' and 'mission and communication'.

Pastor DaeSung Kim, KUC President, also presented a special lecture on 'people sharing life'. He emphasized and appealed to pastors, saying "Pastors, only concentrate on bringing people to the Lord and giving them salvation".

Participants prayed with one accord for revival for the Korean Adventist Church, mission and soul-winning work, and radical repentance and spiritual restoration. They expressed their satisfaction with the overall training program and expected that this program will have a positive influence on spiritual reformation for the church.

#### **Adventist Prayer Center**

While Adventist Training Center continued the pastoral training program, Adventist Prayer Center (APC) provided a training program to 30 pastors and 20 lay people from Japan. They attended the program due to recommendation by Pastor Masumi Shimada, JUC President. Since all pastors in Japan had a 10-day spiritual training at the center in 2006, JUC decided to continuously grant an opportunity to its workers to have this kind of training. Beside Adventist pastors from Beijing and Shanghai, China also participated in the program in August and September, 2011





respectively. Moreover, the Adventist Prayer Center requested that the presidents of Southern Asia Division, Western Africa Division, and Rwanda Union to cooperate in the spiritual training of pastors and lay leaders in their territories.

Pastor KwangEui Hong, APC Director, said "We are receiving requests for help from the world. What we need now is spiritual training." He also explained the excellence of the training contents of the Adventist Prayer Center, which is developing as a specialized world-wide spiritual training institution. The center runs a 40-day, 7-day, and weekend program with 6 different topics and its main target is lay people.





Program the second session of this second run (2B) got off to an enthusiastic start on Monday, August 22 at the Central Philippine Adventist College (CPAC) on the island of Negros, despite many delayed flights for our participants on Sunday. We thank God that just before midnight, everyone arrived safely. English classes, tutorials, leadership seminars, exercise sessions kept everyone busy on a daily basis. All participants enjoyed renewing friendships forged during Session 2A and met three more new participants from China. This time, the group numbered 35 with one from NSD, 15 from the Korean Union Conference, 13 from the Chinese Union Mission, 3 from the Japan Union Conference and 3 from the Mongolia Mission Field.

Our principal teacher, Mrs Erica Hole joined us all the way from Newbold College in England and an assistant teacher, Mrs Leonore Carado, from CPAC itself took care of the English classes while Drs Chek Yat and Sally Phoon handled the leadership seminars with two guest speakers from the area. Dr Amada, president of CPAC and his team prepared a very warm welcome for the group and overextended himself to ensure a







comfortable stay for the participants.

Sabbath was very special for us as we divided the group into 8 teams to preach in different churches in Bacolod City and the CPAC Church. The participants came back with glowing reports of the fellowship they enjoyed with the local Filipino Adventists in small as well as in large churches. For a number of our participants, it was a first time for them to preach or do a mission talk entirely in English—a daunting challenge but it represents another notch up the ladder in their mastery of the English language. We were blessed with the presence of Dr Jairyong Lee, NSD President, that Sabbath. He held a special dialogue with the group of CLAP Chinese students as well as other Chinese students enrolled at CPAC.



Also, together with Dr Lee, the CLAP group did an outreach program on sabbath afternoon to the disadvantaged students who lived in the special cottages at CPAC. All these students value the benefits of a Christian education but do not have the finances to go through College. Hence, living in the cottages (simple

living structures donated and built by local conferences/unions/missions and well-wishers) means that they can work full time as well as take one or two classes as their financial situation allows them. They cook their own meals instead of eating in the cafeteria. Some of them stay for as long as 8 to 10 years to complete their basic degrees. NSD provided the funds to purchase rice for about 200 of these cottage students. Our participants enjoyed distributing this staple and made many friends.

After a most touching visit to several cottages, the CLAP members dug deep into their pockets to donate money to cover the tuition fees for some of these students. Before we left, we handed over 3,000USD to the business office for this purpose. However, this is not



the end but just the beginning; we are still collecting funds to help these diligent and earnest students we left behind in the Philippines. It is gratifying to see the demonstration of love and compassion among our group who have been learning about leadership in addition to English. Indeed leaders are givers, carers, willing to share whatever we have with those who are less fortunate.

We look forward to our next session which will be held in Thailand from March 4 to 16, 2011. In the meantime, participants are again busy with daily assignments in an effort to improve their language skills. What a gratifying experience to see the ease with which our participants are communicating in English during this second session, evidence of their commitment to improve their skills while they are part of CLAP.

They were very pleased to listen to his lecture. The 10th PMMs will have two more training sessions before moving to their respective mission fields, sometime next February.

Family connections, church relations, are powerless to stay them now. Truth is more precious than all besides. Notwithstanding the agencies combined against the truth, a large number take their stand upon the Lord's side" (GC, 612).

The correlation between gospel preaching and hastening Christ's Second Coming is also written as follows. "He does not say that all the world will be converted, but that "this gospel of the kingdom shall be preached in all the world for a witness unto all nations; and then shall the end come." By giving the gospel to the world it is in our power to hasten our Lord's return. We are not only to look for but to hasten the coming of the day of God" (DA, 633).

Today, a number of people who do not know the truth are still waiting for us. We should go out to deliver the truth "through His spirit, by His power, as His hands".

Dear HisHands missionaries, you are the last bastion of mission work in these last days. May the power of the Holy Spirit be with you always. Numerous people will be reached with the truth through your effort and dedication and they will devote their

hearts to God by the indwelling of the Holy Spirit. Then, we will see the accomplishment of the gospel work within our age.

## The Least of You Will Become a Thousand, the Smallest a Mighty Nation

Then we had our farewell in Sahmyook Central Adventist Church to send off the 1000MM, we swore to give 1,000 souls to the Lord. As we were assigned to the mission field, we prayed for this promise: "Then will all your people be righteous and they will possess the land forever. They are the shoot I have planted, the work of my hands, for the display of my splendor. The least of you will become a thousand, the smallest a mighty nation. I am the LORD; in its time I will do this swiftly." (Isaiah 60:21-22)

We arrived at the mission field with happy and hopeful heart. When we shared our goal of winning 1,000 souls with the pastor in our mission field, he wondered. But we just prayed and believed that God will bring souls if we are ready.

On the first day, they visited schools to invite children to the Children's Bible School. About 400 children attended the school every day and learned

about Jesus' love. Dr. WookHyun Cho, a Medical Doctor and Dr. KwangSun Park, a Dentist provided free medical and dental services to more than 570 people. Other missionaries introduced NEWSTART to patients and sung songs together while they were waiting. After the treatment, they also prayed together with them and shared some gifts.

The theme of the evangelistic meeting was Youth on Fire. Pastor Nildo S. Mamac Mmin, Ministerial Director of Zamboanga Conference was the main speaker. Although it was held during the exam period, about 200-300 students attended the meetings every morning. When the speaker made an altar call, many of them responded. On the Sabbath, about 1,500 people worshiped together and 88 people got baptized.
